

Hoof Care Clinic

Stevensville, Montana - August 17th and 18th

The instructor for the clinic is Christoph Schork from Global Endurance in Moab Utah.

Christoph has been researching hoof development for the last 20 years. Working as a farrier in Idaho and Wyoming before moving to Moab, Utah, he studied domestic and wild horse hooves. Constantly on the search for answers on how to improve the health of equine hooves, Christoph traveled to Australia, Europe, Central Asia, North and South America to learn from veterinarians and Equine Hoof Specialists. He is a student of Pete Ramey, Professor Robert Bowker, Dr. Brian Hampson and Professor Chris Pollitt.

Working closely with EasyCare in research and development of hoof boots, he is publishing monthly blogs about hoof care, trimming and hoof protection. He travels frequently within North America and all over Europe to teach Hoof Care Clinics and demonstrates hoof trims and hoof boot selection for training and competition.

Christoph is as much a student as a teacher of hoof care. Because of his vast worldwide experiences and research, he has accumulated a wealth of knowledge about the art of hoof care and offers the opportunity to share this with all of you.

Cost is \$125 for two days (lunch and dinner included on Saturday, lunch on Sunday) and \$75 for one day. If you are coming from out of town, you can camp here...lots of room! This will be very informative for those wanting to transition to barefoot, those who are already barefoot, for farriers and trimmers who would like to learn more about the barefoot horse and for anyone wanting to know more about optimum care of their horses' hooves.
